**CONDITIONAL USE HEARING REY CU 5/15**

Hearing held on Jayson Daeninck application to allow a gun range on W ½ Section 8-12-9E which is a Rural Green Zone (RGZ).

CAO read the notice and letter of intent from Mr. Daeninck.

CAO REQUESTED THAT ANYONE IN FAVOUR OF THE PROPOSAL PRESENT THEIR SUPPORT.

Mr. Daeninck spoke in support of his application, stating that access would be from Pommer Lane and Fire Guard 13 which he would have to gravel; future proposed access would be an extension of Road 50N.

CAO REQUESTED THAT ANYONE OPPOSED TO THE PROPOSAL PRESENT THEIR OBJECTIONS.

Murray Cutmore questioned how far the gun range would be from the snowmobile warmup shack. He also advised that Molson residents can hear the shooting from the gun range on Mile 47E.

Councillor Holmes advised that people in nice cars will not drive down bad roads; people won't change their attitude; use of the gravel pits is free.

Mr. Daeninck advised that the gravel pits have a mixture of quadders, dirt bikers and shooting. It is just a matter of time until something happens.

John Miscavitch reported that a true hunter will use the gun range.

Mr. Daeninck advised that a certified gun range has strict regulations to follow. It is not like the gravel pits where anything goes. Berms 40 feet high will be constructed on the north end of the property to stop bullets. A clubhouse will eventually be constructed at the south end of the property. The shooting direction is north so the sun is not in the shooter's eyes.

Mr. Cutmore questioned if Mr. Daeninck had talked to Brokenhead Game and Fish about the issues they have attracting people to their gun range 3 miles away.

Mr. Daeninck confirmed he had not spoken to Brokenhead Game and Fish.

Mr. Daeninck advised that the gun range would operate during daylight hours on weekends in the spring, summer and fall and also weekdays in the summer. He is currently operating his gun range in Winnipeg but it will be shut down and relocated.


CAO advised that, since there was no other information in support or opposition that the hearing was closed.
