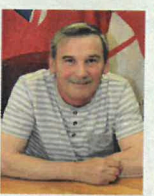
## Councillor Michael Huzel.

# 2019 TAXES, AT A GLANCE

## Summary of Budgeted Revenues:

Requisitions in the amount of \$2,463,832.35 are collected by the RM and remitted to the Public Schools Finance Board and Sunrise and Seine School Divisions on their behalf.

Net Municipal Taxes and Grants in Lieu of Taxes in the amount of \$832,882.21 is derived by taxation.

Other Revenue in the amount of \$939,780.94 is collected by ways other than taxation. This amount consists of added taxes, licences, land leases and sales, various types of fees, interest on investments, penalties, grants, rebates, and other misc. revenues.

Reserve Transfers in the amount of \$50,000. This amount is from the Gas Tax Reserve to help offset Road and Drainage work.

## Summary of Budgeted Expenditures:

**GENERAL GOVERNMENT SERVICES** in the amount of \$510,507.27 (28%) represents Council expenses, office staff, payroll contributions, office expenses, legal, audit, assessment, taxation, training and education, insurance, grants to organizations, and other miscellaneous expenses. An overall Decrease of \$103,715.00 from last year's budgeted amount.

**PROTECTIVE SERVICES** in the amount of \$213,410 (12%) includes Fire and EMO.

**TRANSPORTATION SERVICES** in the amount of \$554,724 (30%) includes wages, repairs maintenance, vehicle insurance and registrations, shop and yard operations, vehicle expenses, road maintenance labour and materials, ditch and road drainage, snow and ice removal, street lighting, traffic services and other miscellaneous services. An overall decrease of \$58,605.00

**ENVIRONMENTAL HEALTH SERVICE** in the amount of \$109,512 (6%) includes all WDG and recycling expenses.

**PUBLIC HEALTH AND WELFARE SERVICES.** In the amount of \$15,497 (1%) represents the Provincial requirement for social assistance, and animal impoundment.

**ENVIRONMENTAL DEVELOPMENT SERVICES IN THE AMOUNT OF \$42,335 (2%)** reflects the cost of planning and zoning.

**ECONOMIC DEVELOPMENT SERVICES** in the amount of \$10,650 (1%) This amount shows a large decrease due to reallocation of Drainage expenses having been moved to Public Works.

**FISCAL SERVICES** in the amount of \$150,000 (8%) is for contribution to capital projects.

**TRANSFERS** in the amount of \$215,400 (12%) includes all transfer payments to reserves. This includes a One time doubling of Gas tax revenue from the Federal government in 2019.

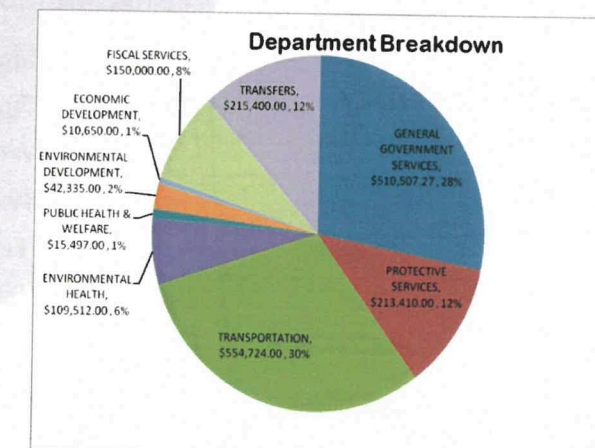
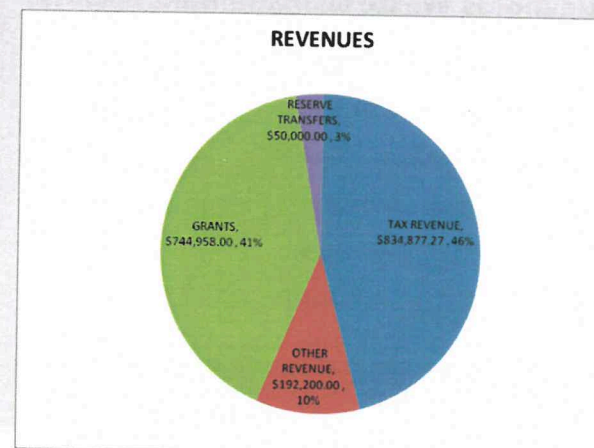
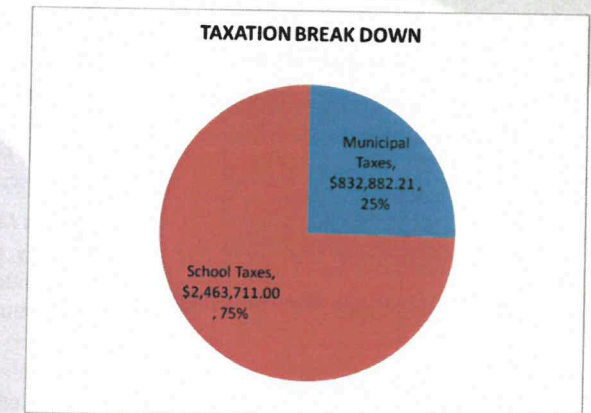

On a Less happy note, we have been experiencing some problems at our recycle sheds throughout the municipality. These facilities have been provided as a convenience for you for household recyclables ONLY. No Household or yard waste, or electronics can be dropped off at the recycle sheds. We have been working with MB Conservation who have, and will, charge any person found to be dumping garbage at these sites. Violations will not be tolerated. Please help us to keep our Communities clean!

In 2019, the Province of Manitoba has shifted the responsibility of speed limits on Municipal roads onto Municipalities. This will be a long process as we examine those areas that may need speed limit adjustment.
