With the onset of a dry spring, Forest and Grass Fires were a great threat to our Community. Please only burn in approved Firepits and Burn Barrels and only after 6:00 pm without a permit. Every Manitoba household needs an emergency plan. Below is an important message from the Reynolds Fire Chief.

## FIRE PROTECTION AND SAFETY INFORMATION

Reynolds Fire Department suggestions for all municipal residents to follow to ensure effective fire protection and the safety of all residents and fire fighters.

1. Clean up your yard to prevent fueling fires that may occur.
2. Make emergency plans BEFORE emergencies happen. Have a personal plan.
3. Stay away from fire incident areas and surrounding roads.
4. If in an incident area, please follow directions from the Fire Department immediately.
5. During incidents shelter in place. If evacuation is necessary, we can find and inform you. Be prepared to evacuate.

The Reynolds Fire Department needs your co-operation. This will help keep you, your neighbours and all fire fighters safe before and during an emergency.
