REYNOLDS FIRE DEPARTMENT NEWS

Currently have 19 members, 2 firefighters with Level 2, 2 firefighters with Level 1 and 12 firefighters in Level 1 training.

The entire department has been revamped, including the way the trucks are organized and operating procedures put in place for any type of emergency they will encounter. Every member has clear direction as to their role within the department. They have a solid chain of command in place. A new “to us” pumper was purchased, which has been nothing but excellent for them. They purchased a set of rescue air bags and a second set of jaws of life. Essentially, they have a very tight-knit group of members that work well together, and the department is doing very well.

FIRE PROTECTION AND SAFETY INFORMATION

Reynolds Fire Department suggestions for all municipal residents to follow to ensure effective fire protection and the safety of all residents and fire fighters.
