Sky Trackers...science fiction

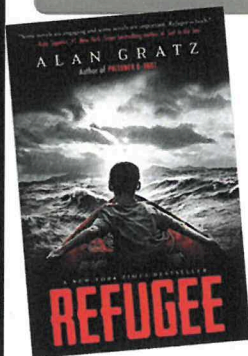

Now on our Shelves

W is for Wasted ~ *Sue Grafton*

"Two dead men changed the course of my life that fall. One of them I knew and the other I'd never laid eyes on until I saw him in the morgue."

X ~ *Sue Grafton*

Perhaps her darkest and most chilling novel, it features a remorseless serial killer who leaves no trace of his crimes. Kinsey wastes little time in identifying this sociopath, but has to prove her case before she becomes his next victim.

Y is for Yesterday ~ *Sue Grafton*

Story begins in 1979, when four teenage boys from an elite private school sexually assault a fourteen-year-old classmate - and film the attack. Not long after, the tape goes missing and the suspected thief, a fellow classmate, is murdered.

The View from Rainshadow Bay ~ *Colleen Cobble*

The book opens with a heart-pounding, run-for-your-life chase and continues with a keen sense of pacing and escalating danger, placing Cobble firmly at the top of the suspense genre.

The House at Saltwater Point ~ *Colleen Cobble*

This follow-up book to *The View from Rainshadow Bay* features delightful characters and an evocative, atmospheric setting. Ideal for fans of romantic suspense.

The Second Half ~ *Lauraieen Snelling*

A heartfelt story of a couple who, when their son becomes missing in action on a military assignment, put their plans for a peaceful retirement on hold to assume guardianship of their young grandchildren.

Sleeping Beauties ~ *Stephen King/Owen King*

In a future so real and near it might be now, a mysterious pandemic is causing women everywhere to suddenly go to sleep, shrouded in a cocoon-like gauze. Any attempt to awaken them is met with a reaction of feral, spectacular violence. And while they sleep, the women go to another place...a better place.

A book all about our differences...skin color, sizes, gender and much more. With rollicking text and delicious illustrations, the book celebrates how we are all different, and yet the same.


Blizzard Besties ~ *Yamile Saied Mendez*
